- You will analyze polls from each of the 50 states.
- After analyzing the polls from the state, you will determine who you think will win that state.
 - Be sure to analyze multiple polls from each state.
 - Does the poll contain 2 candidates or 4?
 - Look for trends.
 - Is one candidate consistently gaining ground?
- For each state, you will explain why you believe a particular candidate will win that state.
 - Who is winning in each state?
 - Be sure to explain when the poll was conducted. MAKE SURE THEY ARE CURRENT!
 - \circ Ex.
- MONTANA: I believe that Donald Trump will win in Montana. I believe that Trump will win in Montana for a handful of reasons. First, Montana has consistently voted for the Republican presidential since 1996 (ballotpedia).
 - Continue on by explaining why Trumps positions would encourage a Montanan to vote for him.
- You will add an additional section at the end of your paper analyzing the popular vote compared to the electoral college map you are predicting.
 - Is the outcome the same? Why or why not?
- You will then create an map of the electoral college based upon you analysis of the polls

- You will create a works cited page listing all the sources you used for your research

 - o Cover page
 - o Page numbers
 - Indentations
